eye

(slang) peepers, glim, lamps

eye

sight, vision, perception, look

He quickly ran his **eyes** around the room.

eye

view, judgement, estimation, opinion, belief
In my **eyes**, you did not do the right thing.

eye

appreciation, awareness, sensitivity

She thinks he's handsome because she has loving eyes.

eye

watch, surveillance, lookout, observation
Stay here and keep an **eye** out for the police.

to eye

to view, to see, to catch sight of, to look at

to eye

(slang) to eyeball

to eye

to watch, to keep in view, to not let out of
one's sight

to eye

to observe, to look on, to survey, to scan
The police **eyed** the crowd.

to eye

to scrutinize, to inspect, to peer at
He **eyed** the material slowly and carefully.

to eye

(slang) to goggle, to gawk at, to ogle, to leer at, to undress with one's eyes, to give the once over, to follow with the eyes

all eyes

everyone, everybody, all persons present
All **eyes** were on him.

all eyes

on guard, wary, on watch for
You must always be **all eyes**.

all eyes

(informal) mindful, with eyes open, on one's
toes, heads up

all eyes

give one one's full or undivided attention
to, paying strict attention to
You have their attention; they
are all eyes.

all eyes and ears

on guard, on watch for, cautious, careful

all eyes focused on

fixing everyone's sight or gaze on, having everyone watching intently or closely

an eye for an eye

taking revenge or vengeance on,
avenging oneself in kind

I do believe in **an eye for an eye**
and a tooth for a tooth.



Argus eyes

(classical reference) a giant with a hundred eyes whose eyes were later transformed into the peacock's tail

Argus eyes

keen-sighted, sharp-sighted, clever, shrewd

as far as the eye can see

boundless, vast, unlimited, extensive

This is his land **as far as the eye can see.**

batting one's eyes

looking at someone to show or
express one's interest or attraction

Batting her eyes, she let him know that
she liked him.

black eye

to have a discoloration of the skin around the eye as a result of a blow to the area

black eye

a black mark, blemish, mark of disgrace
Poverty in such a rich and modern country
as the U.S. is a **black eye**.

black eye

damaged reputation, ill-repute, disrepute, discredit
This will give everyone associated with you a
black eye.

being an eye

plainclothesman, detective, private investigator

being an eye

(slang) gumshoe, bird dog, sleuth, fly ball

Bette Davis eyes

having extraordinarily large eyes which are sexy and bold or which are seductive and direct

clear-eyed

astute, sharp, sound, stable, wide-awake, quick

droopy eyes

having half asleep, drowsy exhausted or tired eyes

enchanting eyes

bewitching, arresting, mesmerizing or
intriguing eyes

It was hard to resist his **enchanting eyes**.

eye for

talent, skill, gift or aptitude for
He has an **eye for** photography.

eyeball-to-eyeball

facing one another, standing in front of or looking
at one another

eyeball-to-eyeball

in opposition, confronting, standing in opposition,
challenging, facing in defiance

eye catching

appealing, mesmerizing, fascinating, hypnotizing,
drawing, engrossing, luring

eye contact

looking someone directly in the face or in the eyes
When we made **eye contact**, we fell in love.

eye opener

something which forces someone to confront
or deal with reality

His behavior was a real **eye opener**.



eyewitness

witness, onlooker, bystander

She was an **eyewitness** to the robbery.

in the eyes of

a manner or way of looking at something
In the eyes of the law, you are guilty.

to eye

to look at, observe, examine with the eye
She **eyed** the book before buying it.

to give one the eye

to stare or glare at, to look daggers at
When I started misbehaving, my father
gave me the eye.

to only have eyes for

to be attracted or drawn to, to be interested in
I **only have eyes for** my husband.

to keep an eye on

to take care of, to watch over, to make sure
everything is alright

Please keep an eye on my children while I'm out.



to keep one's eyes open

to remain attentive, awake or alert to
You must **keep your eyes open** to all possibilities.

to set eyes on

to catch sight of, to look at, to see

The minute he **set eyes on** her, he fell in love.

to run one's eyes over

to glance at, to cast a brief look at,
to look quickly at

She **ran her eyes over** her daughter's dress.

to see eye to eye

to agree, to concur with, to think alike, to
be of one mind

to shut one's eye to

to purposely remain ignorant of, to see no evil, to
remain blind to

to be a sight for sore eyes

to be very happy or glad to see someone
I'm glad that you're here. You **are a sight
for sore eyes.**
